


BIO

Author Q&A

What was your inspiration for You're Here for a Purpose?

Shortly after my daughter was born, I found myself constantly whispering affirmations to her. As I rocked her to sleep, as I gave her a bath, as I got her dressed. Positive affirmations were always on my lips. Even at that tender age, I wanted her to know that she was wanted, she was special, she was important, and she was loved. So, I started writing down the affirmations I would recite to her. Then the idea came to me to write a book about affirmations, but that idea ballooned into writing a book about purpose, and then weaving in the positive affirmations

Why are there 3 different children in the book instead of one main character?

When I first wrote the book, I imagined a little girl as the sole main character. But, I quickly realized there are already so many black children's book that featured little girls. It became important to me that the story had a black boy, a black girl, and a mixed-race child. So the final book features 3 different children, interacting with 3 different parental figures.

Any advice for children out there?

I will quote You're Here for a Purpose for this: "God whispered your name, long before you came.

The world, without you, would not be the same." You are uniquely and wonderfully made, so set God size goals that are bigger than your own imagination and never stop striving for them, no matter how hard it seems. Believe in yourself, and never give up!
